In our church there are three different terms that are used in the New Testament to refer to the same church leader.

1. "Poimen" "Pastor or Shepherd."

2. "Presbuteros" "Elder" in Greek. "Presbyterian"

3. "Episcopos" "Overseer" or "Bishop". "Episcopalian"

"Paul sent to Ephesus for the elders [Presbuteros] of the church. When they arrived he said to them, 'Guard yourselves and all the flock of God which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers [Episcopos]. ... Be pastors [Poimen] of the church of God."

Acts 20:17,18,28

III. The church is a body.

From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

- 6. We will oppose all conduct that compromises our Christian testimony. Instead, we will uphold high standards of Christian morality and godliness.
- 7. We will bear one and other's burdens and sorrows, showing love and forbearance. We will encourage one another to grow in grace and knowledge our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
- 8. We will be accountable in our Christian conduct to the other members of this body, and will, if necessary, submit to biblically mandated discipline imposed by it.
- 9. We understand that, as members, we cannot revoke our membership if we are under disciplinary review.

I. The Bible says the church is a <u>fellowship</u>.

"They continued steadily learning the teaching of the apostles and joined in the fellowship." Acts 2:42
