Judges 4: 7 — "I will give you victory over him" (Sisera) 8 "I will go, but only if you will go with me!" 9 "Very well," she replied, "I will go with you. But since you have made this choice, you will receive no honor. For the LORD'S victory over Sisera will be at the hands of a woman."
<b>LIFE-PRINCIPLE</b> : <b>Good decisions</b> flow from a <b>good life</b> a life that is <b>fully aligned</b> with the nature and mind of God.
<i>LIFE-PRINCIPLE</i> : Don't compound bad decisions with more bad decisions.
