








#### "Truth is that which affirms propositionally the nature of reality as it is."

**"affirms propositionally" – a** statement that expresses a concept that is either true **or** false




"reality" - the world or the state of things as they **actually exist**, as opposed to an idealistic or notional idea of them

"Truth is that which <u>affirms propositionally</u> the nature of <u>reality as it is.</u>"





"relativism" - a view that ethical truths (right & wrong) depend on the individuals and groups holding them


