




Key Understanding:

Righteous Anger Represented by David


Toxic anger always makes things WORSE


Righteous anger always makes things BETTER






I accept this award in behalf of a civil rights movement which is moving with determination and a majestic scorn for risk and danger to establish a reign of freedom and a rule of justice.

"Now's your opportunity!" David's men whispered to him. "Today the Lord is telling you, 'I will certainly put your enemy into your power, to do with as you wish." 1 Samuel 24:4

"The Lord forbid that I should do this to my lord the king and attack the Lord's anointed one, for the Lord himself has chosen him." 7 So David restrained his men and did not let them kill Saul. 1 Samuel 24:6,7

They only want JUSTICE to be meted out for others never for themselves.





"Get your swords!" was David's reply as he strapped on his own. ..."A lot of good it did to help this fellow. We protected his flocks in the wilderness, and nothing he owned was lost or stolen. But he has repaid me evil for good. 22 May God strike me and kill me if even one man of his household is still alive tomorrow morning!"
