The story of the King ... who came to serve.

## **REST:**

<sup>31</sup>Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and **get some rest**." <sup>32</sup> So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. -Mk. 6:31-32
