"Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes and like reetings in the marketplaces ³⁹ and have the best seats in the synagogues and he places of honor at feasts, ⁴⁰ who devour widows' houses and for a pretense hake long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."
I Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the offering box. Many rich people put in arge amounts. I But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper oins, worth less than a penny.
³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow as put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴ They all gave out of their bundance ; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything —all she had to live in." Mark 12:38—44
