The Story of Naaman a Most Unlikely Convert to Meet God Now Naaman was commander of the army of the king of Aram. He was a great man in the sight of his master and highly regarded, because through him the Lord had given victory to Aram. He was a valiant soldier, but he had leprosy.

my master has sent me to tell you that two young prophets from the hil country of Ephraim have just arrived. He would like 75 pounds of silver and two sets of clothing to give to them." Vs.22

"By all means, take twice as much silver," Naaman insisted. ... Gehazi took the gifts from the servants and sent the men back. Then he went and hid the gifts inside the house. Vs 23.24
