<u>Life Lesson:</u>

No matter what the trouble is *-self inflicted or not-* not only is it ok to cry out God, *it makes sense to do it* because He is the best help we have!

This is the first of many "Lament" Psalms. David Howard (Professor of Old Testament at Bethel Seminary) says, "Laments are the psalms where David or the other psalmists are pouring out their hearts to God, being honest about the fact that life, at time, stinks!"
