
Sarah Laughed Genesis 18








Do you see how this confronts our intuitive beliefs about God?


We tend to think that God will answer our prayers only if we have enough faith, but here we see God answering the prayers of those who have no faith.



We tend to think that we should put on our best face before God, praying the prayers we think he wants to hear, not voicing the real truth of how we feel. In short, we don't really believe that he is our friend. We believe that he is a distant deity, at best ambivalent toward us, ready to cut us off in an instant if he senses weakness or dividedness in our hearts.



So we hide and deny our sins, pretending to God and one another that we are living the victorious Christian life, when the truth is the very opposite. We doubt that he has our best interests at heart, disbelieving the promises in his Word that he will protect us, provide for us, sanctify us, and work all things together four our good.




Yet God knows your persistent doubts, your insistent fears, your unfulfilled dreams, and your dark desires, and when you spread them out before him he deals with you gently and graciously, as with a friend.




Don't <u>give up</u> Don't <u>give up on God</u>

This is not a promise to claim but an attribute to embrace, a faith to aspire to, and a hope to sustain us. When we face difficult circumstances, we cannot claim this verse as confidence that God will change our circumstances.



He is capable of changing any circumstances, but perhaps the hard thing that he will do is to help us to accept our circumstances and grow through them. We must be cautious that as we accept by faith that nothing is too hard for God, we do not begin to dictate to him which hard thing he must do. He tends to have things in mind that go beyond what we are able to ask or even think.


ABRAHAMS ACCORDING TO

Genesis 18:16-33

To be blessed in this context means to have one who intercedes before God regarding one's destiny, to have one who "makes intercession for the transgressor" (Isaiah 53:12).
