






- e. It serves as a "WARNING" sign. Matt.3:10, 5:13; Jn. 5:14




2. Does God "send" people to Hell?

c. It's about rules AND a relationship. Genesis 1:26

There are only two kinds of people- those who say "Thy will be done" to God or those whom God in the end says, "Thy will be done." All that are in Hell choose it.







3. Why doesn't God forgive everyone?

a. Because God's anger is aroused by evil and injustice, they destroy the very things He loves.

-Psalm 5:4-6

If you love someone (or something) and you see someone ruining them -even they themselves- you get angry. Becky Pippert says it this way in her book "Hope has a Reason": Think how you feel when someone we love is ravaged by an unwise actions or relationships. Do we respond with benign tolerance? ... God's wrath is not a cranky explosion, but His settled opposition to the cancer... which is eating out the insides of the human race He loves with His whole being.



Miroslav Volf writes: If God were not angry at injustice and deception and did not make a final end to violence - that God would not be worthy of worship.
