






Exodus 11:4 - 6



Exodus 8:25 - “Go, sacrifice to your God *here in the land.*”

Exodus 8:28 - “I will let you go to offer sacrifices to the Lord your God in the wilderness, but *you must not go very far.*”

Matthew 26:39 – “My Father! If it is possible, let this cup of suffering be taken away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine.”(NLT)







What is Jesus' connection with the Passover?

“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!” John 1:29 NIV

With his own blood—not the blood of goats and calves — he entered the Most Holy Place once for all time and secured our redemption forever. Hebrews 9:12 NIV

What is Jesus' connection with the Passover?

¹ The law is only a shadow of the good things that are coming—not the realities themselves. For this reason it can never, by the same sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, make perfect those who draw near to worship. ² Otherwise, would they not have stopped being offered? For the worshipers would have been cleansed once for all, and would no longer have felt guilty for their sins. ³ But those sacrifices are an annual reminder of sins. ⁴ It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Hebrews 10:1 - 10 NIV

⁵ Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said:
“Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; ⁶ with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased.


What is Jesus' connection with the Passover?

⁸ First he said, “Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them”—though they were offered in accordance with the law. ⁹ Then he said, “Here I am, I have come to do your will.” He sets aside the first to establish the second. ¹⁰ And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
