David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been Uriah's wife, ⁷ Solomon, Rehoboam, Abijah, ⁸ Asa, Jehoshaphat, Jehoram, ⁹ Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, ¹⁰ Hezekiah, Manasseh, Amon, ¹¹ and Josiah the father of Jeconiah and his brothers at the time of the exile to Babylon. 12 After the exile to Babylon: Jeconiah, Shealtiel, ¹³ Zerubbabel, Abihud, Eliakim, ¹⁴ Azor, Zadok, Akim, ¹⁵ Elihud, Eleazar, Matthan, ¹⁶ Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah. ¹⁷ Thus there were fourteen generations in all from Abraham to David, fourteen from David to the exile to Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the Messiah.
