Three Resources to Face Suffering Job 13:20-24; 14:7-17 (Reading by Lori Mason)

Job 13:

20 "O God, grant me these two things, and then I will be able to face you. 21 Remove your heavy hand from me, and don't terrify me with your awesome presence. 22 Now summon me, and I will answer! Or let me speak to you, and you reply. 23 Tell me, what have I done wrong? Show me my rebellion and my sin. 24 Why do you turn away from me. Why do you treat me as your enemy?

Job 14

The Word of God

1. God's presence in a world of suffering.

Now summon me, and I will answer! Or let me speak to you, and you reply. Job 13:22

In verse 20 he says, "I don't want to hide my face from you." In verse 24 he says, "I don't want you to turn away from me."

What is it he wants? He says, "I want you to summon me." In Hebrew idiom, that means, "I want your companionship."

Remove your heavy hand from me, and don't terrify me with your awesome presence. 22 Now summon me, and I will answer! Job 13:21,22

Job is saying summon me, he's saying *I need a vision of you, something tangible,* in order to get the strength to get through your suffering?

Job needed a sign from God to get through his suffering. For us that sign is already here in the life of Christ.

So we know one thing for sure; we know what the reason for your suffering *isn't*. It's not that God doesn't care for you.

2. Suffering produces glory

"Even a tree has more hope! If it is cut down, it will sprout again and grow new branches. 8 Though its roots have grown old in the earth and its stump decays, 9 at the scent of water it will bud and sprout again like a new seedling. 10 "But when people die, their strength is gone. They breathe their last, and then where are they? Job 14:7-10

We're told everywhere in the Bible that glory and suffering go together.

1 Peter 4:14, "If you suffer, you are blessed, for the Spirit of Christ's glory rests on you,"

Romans 8:18, "Our present sufferings are not worthy to even be compared to the glory that will be revealed in us,"

2 Corinthians 4:16,17 "Though outwardly we are wasting away, inwardly we're being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary afflictions are achieving for us an <u>eternal weight of glory</u> beyond all comparison."

For it is commendable if someone bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because they are conscious of God. 1 Peter 2:19

20 But how is it to your credit if you receive a beating for doing wrong and endure it? 1 Peter 2:20a

But if you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. vs.20b

21 To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. 22 "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth."23 When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. 1 Peter 2:21-23a

Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. vs.23b
