## Mystery


Often God's plans and work can't easily be seen or understood. Even when we can't see it **HE IS** working all things out for His good purposes and for those who love Him.

- 1. Don't beat yourself up when you can't seem to figure out what God is doing in your life. -Gen 37-50
- 2. Patience REALLY is a virtue! 1Cor. 13:4 & Gal. 5:22
- 3. <u>Choose</u> to obey even when you can't see how God is using it for His good.
