Exodus 20:18

Hebrews 12 contrasts Judaism and Christianity. The writer takes the scene on Sinai as expressive of the former revelation, whose center was the law, which evoked the consciousness of sin, and kindled terror. So as they drew near to God, they did not have anything close to a warm, cozy, experience.
