## 2. A New Picture Of Relating To God

"While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and 'sinners' came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, 'Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?' " Matthew 9:10.11

#### What's that all about?

The Pharisees and the religious leaders believed not only would the healthy people become sick through contact with the unhealthy, but also that the morally clean, would become unclean through contact with the wrong crowd.

### What is the reason for Jesus blowing off the clean laws?

"It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick." Matthew 9:12

### In Matthew 8, there's a remarkable incident with a leper:

When Jesus came down from the mountainside, large crowds followed him.<sup>2</sup> A man with leprosy came and knelt before him and said, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." <sup>3</sup> Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" Immediately he was cleansed of his leprosy.
