Habakkuk 2:1-4 I will take my stand at my watchpost and station myself on the tower, and look out to see what he will say to me, and what I will answer concerning my complaint.

² And the Lord answered me: "Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so he may run who reads it. ³ For still the vision awaits its appointed time; it hastens to the end—it will not lie. If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay.

⁴ "Behold, his soul is puffed up; it is not upright within him, but the righteous shall live by his faith.

1. Faithful people don't let their questions turn them into quitters.

Habakkuk 2:1 <u>I will keep watching</u>, so I can see what he says to me and can know how I should answer when He counters my argument.

"If you're on guard duty, it doesn't matter whether you feel badly. It doesn't matter whether you're sleepy. It doesn't matter whether you're bored. It doesn't really matter how you feel. It doesn't matter your circumstances. You may not leave your post. You can't. The whole city could be lost. You can't say, "Well, you know, I've been up here day after day. There have never been any enemies. I'm going to knock off early." Or, "I'm tired. I'm bored." It doesn't matter. You cannot leave your post. You must do your duty. This is Habakkuk's way of showing us that even though he is struggling with God, he is struggling enormously with God.
