

#### 1. What is rejoicing in suffering?

<sup>19</sup> The Sovereign Lord is my strength! He makes me as surefooted as a deer, able to tread upon the heights.

The Lord God is my strength, and He has made my feet like hinds' *feet*, and makes me walk on my high places.
