Fact 3- God cares because God works through weakness
Through the praise of children and infants you have established a stronghold
against your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger.

Psalm 8:2 NIV

You have taught children and infants to tell of your strength, silencing your enemies and all who oppose you.

Psalm 8:2 NLT

David's point in verse 2 is that as big as God is, he uses the weak things of the world to humble evil.

Why does God do that?

Because one day He's going to send his own Son and instead of taking power, he lose his power. Instead of a triumphal life on a throne He will end his life on a cross.

And why did he go to the cross? To die for our sins.

And why did he die for our sins? Because he was mindful of us.

1. What David saw of God in Creation.

You have set your glory in the heavens. Psalm 8:1b

The heavens declare the glory of God... Psalm 19:1

When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, Psalm 8:3

and He sustains everything by the mighty power of his command. Hebrews 1:3

2. What David asks of God.

...what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?

Psalm 8:4

David is asking:

"How do I know that the power behind the universe cares about humanity at all?"

Meanwhile we live in a time:

Where most of the people who write the books and teach the courses at the top of the cultural and academic institutions all say were here by accident.

If there is no God does anything we do matter?

The secular understanding of the universe without God is it's going to devour everything and everyone and hope is just a psychological ploy to survive as a species. Nothing you do matters. It will be as if none of you ever existed.

3. What David learned of God's care.

You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor. ⁶You made them rulers over the works of your hands; you put everything under their feet: ⁷ all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild, ⁸ the birds in the sky, and the fish in the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas. Psalm 8:5-8

David returns to scripture from Genesis 1 and 2 and uses the language that says human beings are made in God's image.

- ...crowned him with glory and honor.
- ...given him dominion over the works of your hands;

These are attributes normally reserved to describe God, yet they are ascribed to humanity is what David wants us to see.

When God created us, he put his image on us. He made us rational, moral and He made us self-conscious.

Fact 1- God cares because we are made in His image.

Fact 2- God cares because He sought us out
