
Genesis 3:7-9

Paradise Lost Genesis 3:1-9

¹Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden?'" ²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, ³but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'" ⁴"You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. ⁵"For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. ⁷Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves. ⁸Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"

Who is the serpent? Everybody understands him to be the Devil, or Satan. The being whom Jesus Christ called "*the ruler of this world*".

Apostle James has described the Devil's strategy very plainly.

Temptation comes from our own desires, which entice us and drag us away. ¹⁵These desires give birth to sinful actions. And when sin is allowed to grow, it gives birth to death.

James 1:14,15

Temptations Steps:

Devil's first tactic is to arouse desire.

Temptation comes from our own desires which entice us ...

Devil's second tactic is letting suspicion run its course.

These desires give birth to sinful actions...

Devil, lastly, seizes the opportunity afforded by the evil act to produce the results that the Scripture describes as death.

...when sin is allowed to grow, it gives birth to death...

Here's how the Devil works on Eve's heart:

Step #1- is to make Eve want to sin by instilling a distrust in God's love.

"Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden?'" Genesis 3:1

Eve's answer is straight forward.

²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden,...

Eve should have stopped there. However she continues:

³but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.' "

Step #2-The Devil openly substitutes a lie for the truth.

"You won't die!" vs. 4

The Devil cleverly plants a doubt in this woman's heart with an outright lie, declaring that what God had said would not happen.

Step #3- The Devil supports his lie by distorting the truth.

"For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." vs. 5

Satan's biggest offer is simple, you'll become like God.

Yes, they knew God, but they wouldn't worship him as God or even give him thanks. And they began to think up foolish ideas of what God was like. As a result, their minds became dark and confused. ...²⁵They traded the truth about God for a lie. Romans 1:21, 25

Their eyes were opened but for all the wrong reasons.

The woman was convinced. She saw that the tree was beautiful and its fruit looked delicious, and she wanted the wisdom it would give her. So she took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it, too. ⁷At that moment their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. Genesis 3:6,7

They both accepted the idea that God was holding out on them. But when their eyes were opened it was shameful.
