# Advent - Hope, Peace, Love, Joy

"Biblical hope isn't optimism based on the odds. It's a choice to wait for God to bring about a future that is as surprising as a crucified man rising from the dead. Christian hope looks back to the risen Jesus in order to look forward."

## 1. A Fulfilled Promise

The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation.

## 2. The Purpose of Salvation

# 3. John Will Prepare the Way for the Messiah
