Chapter 32-34

32:1 When the people saw that Moses was so long in coming down from the mountain, they gathered around Aaron and said, "Come, make us gods who will go before us. As for this fellow Moses who brought us up out of Egypt, we don't know what has happened to him.

32:5-6 When Aaron saw this, he built an altar in front of the calf and announced, "Tomorrow there will be a festival to the Lord." ⁶ So the next day the people rose early and sacrificed burnt offerings and presented fellowship offerings. Afterward they sat down to eat and drink and got up to indulge in revelry.

32:19 When Moses approached the camp and saw the calf and the dancing, his anger burned and he threw the tablets out of his hands, breaking them to pieces at the foot of the mountain.

33:1 Then the Lord said to Moses,
“Leave this place, you and the people
you brought up out of Egypt, and go
up to the land I promised on oath to
Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, saying, ‘I
will give it to your descendants.’

33:15-16 Then Moses said to him, "If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here. ¹⁶ How will anyone know that you are pleased with me and with your people unless you go with us? What else will distinguish me and your people from all the other people on the face of the earth?"


34:1-2 The Lord said to Moses, "Chisel out two stone tablets like the first ones, and I will write on them the words that were on the first tablets, which you broke. ² Be ready in the morning, and then come up on Mount Sinai. Present yourself to me there on top of the mountain.

34:4-7 So Moses chiseled out two stone tablets like the first ones and went up Mount Sinai early in the morning, as the Lord had commanded him; and he carried the two stone tablets in his hands. ⁵ Then the Lord came down in the cloud and stood there with him and proclaimed his name, the Lord. ⁶ And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming,

“The Lord, the Lord, the
compassionate and gracious God,
slow to anger, abounding in love and
faithfulness,⁷ maintaining love to
thousands, and forgiving wickedness,
rebellion and sin. Yet he does not
leave the guilty unpunished



From: Go Away to You Gotta Stay!






Lighting up the World

Moses “glowed” not from following the teachings God gave but from spending time with Him! And people took notice!




