JOHN'S BAPTISM CONSISTED PRIMARILY OF TWO TRUTHS

The forgiveness of sins is possible only on the basis of repentance.

⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptizing, he said to them: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? 8 Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. 9 And do not think you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. 10 The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. **MATTHEW 3:7–10**

Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs. Then he said to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." ... (and) the fig tree withered from the roots.





Pastor MacArthur telling the true story of Rabbi Saccai








