
Why?

The Purpose of Your Spiritual Gift Ephesians 4:7-16

1. What are spiritual gifts?

Spiritual gifts are differing abilities given by the Holy Spirit to each believer to meet needs in such a way that it creates a community of people who are growing into the fullness of the character of Jesus Christ.

A. Spiritual gifts are abilities to meet needs.

Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12, Ephesians 4, and 1 Peter 4. Every one of the lists are different.

B. Spiritual gifts are different and yet given to every believer.

In spite of the fact, we are all one in Christ, spiritual gifts create enormous diversity in churches.

Everybody gets a portion

2. What is the goal of spiritual gifts?

What kind of church does that create?

"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Ephesians 2:10

1st Implication of spiritual gifts:

There are certain things God wants you to do.

How does the believer discover and develop their gifts?

Only foolproof way to discover and use your gifts: Ministry experience. Roll up your sleeves and get to work in some area of ministry.

43 ... Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
Mark 10:43-45

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the <u>pastors and teachers</u>, ¹² to equip his people for works of service. Ephesians 4:11,12

Make no mistake vs 12 indicates clearly that the point of God calling apostles, prophets, evangelists and pastor/teachers is so every Christian can serve in the way they were called to do for the building up of the whole body.

2nd implication of spiritual gifts:

Spiritual fruit has to be the real goal, and spiritual gifts have to be seen only as the means.
