
PAUL'S LETTER TO THE EPHESIANS Chapter 5:2—14







- ⁴³ Never take your word of truth from my mouth, for I have put my hope in your laws.

1 Corinthians 11:1

We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised. (NIV)

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: 6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to cling to; ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross! Philippians 2:5 - 8

21 To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, *leaving* you an example, that you should follow in his steps.

22 "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." 23 When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly.






What is our new identity?
